Yesterday, we received the court's decision regarding Bill Cosby's challenge to the legal sufficiency of our client Judy Huth's lawsuit against him. Mr. Cosby made yet another attempt to have Judy Huth's case thrown out, this time arguing that the statute of limitations barred her claims. We argued that Ms. Huth's case should not be dismissed because her complaint and its accompanying filings all complied with the statute of limitations for allegations of child sexual abuse.

The court agreed with us on this critical issue. The decision is a vindication of our position that this lawsuit should be permitted to proceed to trial and should not be dismissed. We did not believe that there was a valid basis for denying Ms. Huth her day in court. We are very happy that the Court agreed and we will continue to vigorously fight for a just result for our client.

The court did dismiss the negligent infliction of emotional distress claim which was placed in the complaint by Judy Huth's former lawyer. The Court did not agree with the former lawyer on that cause of action. In the Court's view if Mr. Cosby did what Ms. Huth alleges, then that conduct would be intentional, and therefore not negligent. We are able to proceed on our theories of sexual battery and intentional infliction of emotional distress and we believe that those are our most important claims.

Our next step in this case will be to take Hugh Hefner's deposition in May 2016.
