Recently, OK! Magazine published a cover story with the large headline that stated “Tyga In Love With Underage Teen.” The cover displayed a large photo of Kylie Jenner and a smaller photo of the rapper, Tyga. The photo of Tyga contained the caption headline that stated “Kylie Betrayed”. In a circle on the cover was a pixelated photo of the underage teenager in question and photos of what were called “their shocking texts” and an alleged quote from Kylie Jenner stating “you make me sick.”

The story inside suggested that Kylie was upset because she found messages on Tyga’s phone when he was trying to convince the girl to meet with him.
